From Your Associational Missionary

On June 1, 2011 nine people from seven Floyd County Baptist churches left for a mission trip to Kampala, Uganda, Africa. We worked with an organization called International Missionaries for Christ, headed by Jimmy Barry and six Ugandan church planters. We worked with IMB Missionary, Lynn Scuza. We saw 172 people come to Christ, and identified areas for seven house churches. Two of the house churches have already met and had good attendance. We were able to go to a baptism of 29 new believers at Lake Victoria. We joined with them in their first Lord's Supper. We will be returning to Uganda in June of 2012. I hope that others will join us in helping to reach Uganda for Christ.

Thoughts From the Ministry Center



Most of us have been taught that there are two views of the world. First there is the worldview and then the Biblical worldview. During the recent mission trip to Uganda, I discovered a third view. It's the "American View."

Our team worked in the slums of Kampala, Uganda for one week. People who live there have no running water, no bathroom facilities, no fans, no air conditioning... virtually nothing. They receive no government help for food or clothing. They have no health care. Yet these people manage to work at something all the time. They carve a living out of their surroundings and do their best to provide for their families. They don't sit around and wait for the mailman to bring a check. They don't fuss about what they don't have, and they don't blame anyone. The "American View" is just the opposite.

When our team went into these slum areas to talk to the people, they listened. We shared the love of Christ with them. They listened to the wonderful, simple Gospel of Jesus Christ with open hearts and received the message. They didn't ask for anything from us. In fact, they were willing to give us the last bit of food they had.

It would do this country well to adopt the view of the people of Uganda.

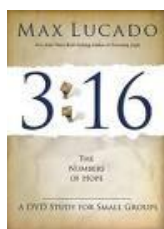

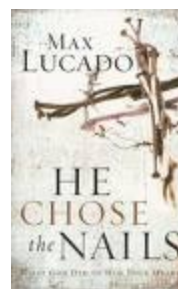
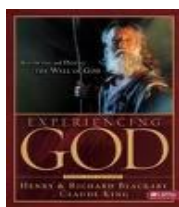
